Yes, deer.

As you, our faithful readers know, we feature a local animal in each of our newsletters. We pick them at random, but this time there was a reason why we decided to pick on the deer. Some of our locals complain about the deer population around here, because the deer eat their flowers, but gosh, they're so darn cute, how can one not like them? They are a danger when you drive around here at night, because you can hit them, and they can cause quite a lot of damage to your car, but again, they're so darn cute...

The reason we're featuring deer this time, is because one of our homeowners, who apparently doesn't mind if the deer eat her flowers, recently took some pictures of deer right in front of her house, in the day time, right here on the island, on Duneside Drive. Deer are mainly nocturnal, and we were amazed that they were caught on film (or on digital) in the day time. So deer it is. While visiting the zoo in Havana, Cuba a few years ago, we passed the exhibit of *Odocoileus Virginianus*. My sister-in-law, our tour guide, explained that these were White-tailed deer and started

telling us all about them. She was so excited that I almost hated to tell her that the white-tailed deer is a common animal around these parts, and that they're very numerous. To Cubans, of course, they're an exotic animal, since they're not found in nature in Cuba, even though their range reaches all the way from southern Canada to Bolivia, in South America.

White-tailed deer are the smallest of the North American deer. The name refers to the white underside of their tail, which stands erect when the animal senses danger. After a gestation period of seven months, the female gives birth around May or June, usually between one to three fawns. Just like Bambi's, their coat is reddish brown with white spots. While the mother goes around looking for food, the fawns are usually left behind, in a hiding spot, where they lie flat on the ground, with their necks outstretched, waiting for mom to return. Deer are herbivores, and their diet consists of leaves, twigs, fruits, nuts, grass, and those beautiful flowers growing in your garden. Their main defense against predators is their speed and agility. They can run up to thirty miles an hour, and jump as high as ten feet, and as far as thirty feet in a single bound. During this time of year it's hard to tell the males from the females, except that bucks are larger than does. During the winter, bucks will cast off their antlers, and they won't grow them back until Spring. While you're here, keep your eyes open around dusk, to spot one of these elusive island residents.




